Abstract

The webinar will explore the concept of Language Alter Ego (LAE) and its application within educational settings, particularly in bilingual, multilingual and multicultural classrooms. The presentation will dive into how LAE, as a theoretical framework, enables learners to construct distinct linguistic and cultural personalities and identities when engaging with foreign languages. It will examine the ways in which LAE influences students' adaptability, emotional intelligence, and cross-cultural communication skills. The presentation will also introduce the concept of "blocks," modular units that integrate LAE into classroom practice, offering educators concrete strategies to foster holistic language acquisition and cultural understanding.
